## Timeline

- 1842** France imposes protectorate over coastal zone of Côte d'Ivoire
- 1892** Côte d'Ivoire made into a colony
- 1904** Côte d'Ivoire becomes part of the French Federation of West Africa
- 1944** Felix Houphouet-Boigny founds a pivotal union of African farmers
- 1958** Côte d'Ivoire becomes a republic within the French Community
- 1960** Côte d'Ivoire becomes independent
- 1960** Felix Houphouet-Boigny becomes first president
- 1985** Official country name changes from "Ivory Coast" to Côte d'Ivoire
- 1990** First multiparty presidential election, and Felix Houphouet-Boigny wins against Laurent Gbagbo
- 1993** Henri Konan Bedie becomes president after death of Houphouet-Boigny
- 1995** Mr Bedie is re-elected in a ballot that is boycotted by opposition parties in protest
- 1999** President Bedie is overthrown in military coup, replaced by General Robert Guei
- 2000** Coup leader Robert Guei loses presidential vote but claims victory anyway
- 2003** War ends with country divided, rebels holding north and government forces holding south
- 2004** First contingent of UN peacekeeping force deployed
- 2007** Rebel leader Guillaume Soro becomes prime minister
- 2010** Gbagbo clings to power, and ensuing violent struggle claims thousands of lives
- 2015** Ouattara takes power and wins reelection
- 2016** New constitution approved
- 2020** COVID-19 Pandemic causes over 20,000 cases and 120 deaths
